- 3. Must have completed one year of high school math course(s) with a grade of C or better, or submit equivalent math placement test scores.**
- 4. Documentation of the requirements listed above must be submitted with application**

D. Qualifying applications will be added to the ranked pool as applications are received by the date the application is received. These individuals will be retained on the list for a period of 2 years.

Manufacturing Plant Electrician (PJ) 4 year program

Install, maintain, replace, and repair electrical wiring and electrical products on or in an existing operable manufacturing plant or industrial plant owned or used by employer. This individual must work under the supervision, direction, and control of a limited supervising electrician. These processes include wire pulling, cables and supports, conduit, flex tray and duct, control panels and controls, wiring devices. Stock room, materials, and finish work are also included in these work processes. They will also install, troubleshoot and maintain:

- 1) Installation of electrical circuits
- 2) Motors and Generators
- 3) Manual and automatic controls, including magnetic and solid state
- 4) Trouble Shooting
- 5) Power Distribution Additional Work hours are also available for training

The Average Journeymen's wage thru June 2026 is \$46.79. An apprentice starts at 50% (\$23.39) of that with 5%-10% pay increases every 1000 on the job hours and 72 school hours.

These standards apply to the geographical area of Deschutes, Crook, Klamath and Jefferson Counties in the State of Oregon.
